The Revolution in Navy Training Today From the Naval Personnel Development Command

News You Can Use

Center for Surface Operations (CSO): Professional Mariner study group meeting planned for first week of February. JTAs for BM/SM/QM completed and forwarded to SkillsNet for development of KSAs. MA Rating JTAs will be completed in January. ATPWDC is meeting to review physical security and force protection related tasks this month.

Center Naval for Aviation Technical Training (CNATT): Exploring the possibility of deploying Advanced Avionics Integrated Weapons Systems Maintenance Course (AVC1) on the Internet. CNATT utilized "Charting a Course," a management tool designed to assist in deciding whether to develop and deploy course work on the Web. The software generates a plan that can be handed off for development. Currently planning an Aviation ESG meeting end of January. The agenda will focus on transfer of CNO N789H responsibilities.

Navy Knowledge Online (NKO): On 21 January, VADM Harms released a NAVADMIN officially introducing Navy Knowledge On-Line (www.nko.navy.mil). NKO is now being utilized to host a series of Chat Rooms for threaded discussion on Metrics, Process Mapping, Functional Integration Managers, Center Directorates, dynamic database integration, NMETLs, etc. Schedules will be announced weekly and be posted on NKO.



Center for Naval Leadership (CNL): Alignment of both Officer and Enlisted Leadership Training Courses (LTC) with the Naval Leadership Competency Model and performance requirements continue. First Line Leader (FLL) pilot course scheduled for week of 21 January. CNL Metrics Working Group completed levels 1 and 2 assessments for FLL. Instructor Training (IT) and Professional Military Education (PME) initiatives are in pre-scoping conferences.

Submarine Learning Center (SLC): Proposal for replacement of SPAN with COTS based Net trainer sent to CNSF for approval. Reviewing Virtual Radio Room to replace Tactical TTE. Currently writing the Learning-KM Vision document and an MOU for cooperation and coordinating with Strategic Programs office.

Center for Information Technology (CIT): Completed draft POAM of IP Basic School curriculum developed in coordination with NETWARCOM, CNO N6, IP COE (NPS Monterey). JTA workshop scheduled for late January at CIT.

Center for Service Support (CSS): Submitted point paper realigning the AZ rating with CENNAVAVNTECHTRA. Merged the AK/SK curriculum taught in Meridian. The concept for merging the DK/PN is now approved paving the way for further analysis at CSS.
